GRAMMAR FOR ADVANCED STUDENTS 02 Unreal Time and Subjunctives

I. It's time

• Its time, its high time

These are followed by the past simple or continuous, though the time referred to is unreal.

- It's time we left.
- It's high time something was done about this!

II. Wishes

• Present / future time

Notice the past verb forms after wish.

These are wishes where you want to change a present / future state.

- I wish I had a motorbike. (I don't have one now.)
- I wish I was going on holiday with you next week. (I am not going.)

Would

Would is used when the speaker wants somebody or something else to change.

- I wish he would change his mind and marry Jane.
- I wish it would stop raining.

The usé with would is often used to describe an annoying habit.

- I wish you wouldn't make such a mess.

Past time

As with present wishes, the verb form after <u>wish</u> is one stage further back in the past. These are wishes referring to a past event, which cannot be changed.

- I wish I hadn't eaten so much.

This use of **wish** is similar to the use of **if only** to express regrets.

• Hope

Wishes about simple future events are expressed with <u>hope + present simple</u>. Sometimes a future form can be used.

- I hope it doesn't rain tomorrow.
- I hope Jim comes /will come to the party tonight.
- I'd rather/I'd prefer (followed by a clause)
- <u>I'd rather</u> is followed by <u>past verb forms</u> in the same way as wishes about the present. It expresses preference about actions.
- I'd rather you didn't smoke in here.

Both <u>I'd rather</u> and <u>I'd sooner</u> are used with infinitive without to when comparing nouns or phrases.

- I'd rather be a doctor than a teacher. (present)
- I'd rather <u>have lived</u> in Hanoi than Haiphong. (past)
- <u>I'd prefer</u> is used with $\underline{it + subject + past verb form}$ to express preference about actions.
- <u>I'd prefer</u> it if you <u>didn't</u> smoke.

<u>I'd prefer</u> is also used with <u>you</u> /<u>him</u> / <u>her</u>, etc <u>+ infinitive</u> with 'to' to show what we would like a person to do. We can add <u>rather than + infinitive</u> without 'to' as a comparison.

- I'd prefer you to sit in your seat (rather than sit on the floor).
- I'd prefer you not to sit on the floor.

<u>I'd prefer + noun</u> can be used to show which thing we would like to have.

- I'd prefer tea to coffee.

III. As if, as though

* Real and unreal

The verb form here depends on whether the situation is true or unreal.

- You look as if you're having second thoughts. (You are having second thoughts.)
- He acts as if he were in charge. (Unreal. He isn't in charge.)
- I feel as if an express train had hit me. (Unreal. It didn't hit me.)

Note however, that the more colloquial <u>like</u> does not require this verb form change.

This use is not considered acceptable, however, in formal or written English. Compare:

- You look <u>like</u> you'<u>ve</u> just <u>seen</u> a ghost. (informal / colloquial)
- You look **as if** you'<u>d</u> just <u>seen</u> a ghost. (formal)

IV. Suppose and imagine

* Understood outcomes

The outcome part of these sentences is often understood but not stated.

- Suppose someone told you that I was a spy! (I'm not sure about it.)
- *Imagine we'd never met!* (We have met.)

If the event referred to is a real possibility, a <u>present verb form</u> is possible.

- Suppose it starts raining, what'll we do?

Formal subjunctives

* Insisting, demanding, etc.

After verbs such as <u>demand</u>, <u>insist</u>, <u>suggest</u>, <u>require</u>, which imply obligation, the subjunctive may be used in formal style. The subjunctive is the same verb form as the infinitive; there is no third person -s or past form.

- They demanded that he <u>leave</u> at once.
- The school Principal suggested that he **be** awarded a scholarship.

* Less formal usage

Less formally, **should** can be used, and colloquially no verb form change is made.

- They demanded that he **<u>should</u>** leave.
- They demanded that he <u>left</u>. (informal)

Formulaic subjunctives

These are fixed expressions all using the subjunctive. Typical expressions are:

- Heaven <u>help</u> us! <u>Be</u> that as it may ... <u>Come</u> what may ...
